Module “Market- and Non-Market Valuation of Environmental Goods” (075 016)

Information and requirements

The valuation of environmental goods and amenities is often complicated by the lack of market prices. This seminar will deal with distinct empirical methods to estimate the value of environmental goods and amenities. Methods to be covered include both market and non-market valuation methods, such as hedonic pricing, contingent valuation and revealed preference methods to elicit willingness-to-pay.

Topic Assignment

During the introductory course on **October 18th, 2019** (10 a.m., RWI – Leibniz-Institute for Economic Research ; s. attached information) a maximum of two papers out of the list of topics is assigned to each participant of the seminar. The participants are expected to summarize and critically review its content and comment on the scientific context and related literature in a written elaboration. If you are especially interested in a certain topic, you can inform us in advance via Email. We cannot guarantee to meet all preferences.

Term paper

The term paper should be in English and around ~ 10 pages in length with a tolerance of plus/ minus one page (font Verdana, size 10, line spacing 1 ½).*

Presentation of the term paper

In addition, the term paper has to be presented by means of a Power Point presentation. Each participant has 15 minutes to present the term paper. The correspondent term papers and presentations will be sent per Email in due time before the date of the seminar.
